Commissioner Kavanaugh motioned and Commissioner Marr seconded to approve the following Resolution by the Johnson County Commission of the State of Missouri establishing January 20-26, 2019 as Johnson County School Choice Week. Motion approved unanimously. Commissioner Gabel read the Proclamation Commemorating Johnson County School Choice Week WHEREAS, all children in Johnson County should have access to the highest-quality education possible; and, WHEREAS, Johnson County recognizes the important role that an effective education plays in preparing all students in Johnson County to be successful adults; and, WHEREAS, quality education is critically important to the economic vitality of Johnson County; and, WHEREAS, Johnson County is home to a multitude of high quality public and nonpublic schools from which parents can choose for their children, in addition to families who educate their children in the home; and, WHEREAS, educational variety not only helps to diversify our economy, but also enhances the vibrancy of our community; and, WHEREAS, Johnson County has many high-quality teaching professionals in all types of school settings who are committed to educating our children; and, WHEREAS, School Choice Week is celebrated across the country by millions of students, parents, educators, schools and organizations to raise awareness of the need for effective educational options; NOW, THEREFORE, We, THE JOHNSON COUNTY COMMISSION do hereby recognize January 20-26, 2019 as Johnson County School Choice Week, and we call this observance to the attention of all of our citizens.

The Commissioners reviewed and approved the minutes from previous week.

Commissioner Kavanaugh and Commissioner Marr met with Amber Bradbury regarding updates for the Warrensburg Main Street Monthly Update. Discussion included 2019 BurgFest and future development plans for the West side of the courthouse including the parking lot.

Johnson County received the sales tax distribution for the month of December 2018 from the Missouri Department of Revenue. The monies were distributed as follows: General Revenue: \$226,457.70; Jail: \$113,184.07, Road and Bridge: \$226,457.83; Law Enforcement: \$226,383.89 and Road Use Tax: \$111,235.29.

The Commissioners met with Gary Bell, Road and Bridge Supervisor. The Commissioners stated their appreciation for the work done to clear county road of the winter weather precipitation. It was noted that areas of Johnson County had eight (8) to ten (10) inches of snow. Bell expressed that although there have been many calls of appreciation, there have also been calls expressing frustration or requesting additional service. Also discussed was the anticipated winter weather to arrive on January 18, 2019. Commissioner Kavanaugh asked if the Road and Bridge Department had a generator; Bell stated they did not. Commissioner Kavanaugh requested Bell research the cost of moving the generator currently located at the courthouse (not suitable for use at the courthouse [due to limited amperage], previously used at the old jail and detention center) and installing transfer switches so the generator could be utilized.

The Commissioners met with Dan Ewing, Maintenance Supervisor, regarding concerns of snow fall from the roof of the courthouse. Ewing noted any amount of snow accumulated on the roof is a potential danger since the snow falls in large chunks on the sidewalks due to the slick surface of the shingles, angle of the roof and closeness of the sidewalk to the courthouse. Commissioner Marr noted that Heather Reynolds, Treasurer, previously reported metal pieces falling off the roof with melting snow. The Commissioners instructed Ewing to close the sidewalk. Ewing later approached the Commission to consider contacting All Trades Historical Restoration since the roof should be under warranty. Commissioner Gabel contact Cassie Hollis, All Trades Historical Restoration and reviewed the situation. Hollis stated she would research options to prevent this type of hazard.

The Commissioners along with Troy Armstrong, Emergency Management Director, presented a Certificate of Commendation to Johnson County Road & Bridge: A significant winter weather impacted Johnson County Saturday, January 11th, 2019; with portions of Johnson County receiving over eight inches of heavy, wet snow accumulation.

On Saturday, January 12th, 2019 the Johnson County Emergency Management Agency received notification of a hospice client requiring home use medical devise, and was experiencing a power outage. As the client's situation progressed, she eventually requested Emergency Medical Services and transport to a hospital. Units from the Johnson County Sheriff's Office, Johnson County Ambulance District, and Johnson County Fire Protection District were initially dispatched.

Upon arrival of initial units, the roadway and client's driveway were found to be snow packed and impassable. A unit from Johnson County Road & Bridge was requested to respond to the scene and assist with access to the client's home.

Due to the rapid response from Johnson County Road & Bridge, EMS personnel were able to gain access to the client.

The Honorable Johnson County Commission met this day pursuant to adjournment. Present: Bill Gabel, Presiding Commissioner; John Marr, Eastern Commissioner; Charles Kavanaugh, Western Commissioner and Diane Thompson, County Clerk. The following proceedings were had to-wit:

The Commissioners met with Sheriff Scott Munsterman and Major Hugh Fowler requesting the Presiding Commissioner, Bill Gabel sign a State Plan of Operation between the State of Missouri and the Johnson County Sheriff's Office with updates in the Missouri Department of LESO Program Application.

The Commissioners reviewed and discussed the drafted Order of the County Commission of Johnson County, Missouri as prepared by Travis Elliot. Also present was Sheriff Scott Munsterman, Major Hugh Fowler, Sue Sterling, Daily Star Journal. Munsterman reviewed the two current sources of revenue (LEST: Law Enforcement Sales Tax and Jail Housing Costs-housing prisoners from other jurisdictions). Elliot explained the LEST that passed in 2009 maxes out at one cent and currently is at one-half of one cent. It was discussed that adding to the current LEST would not bring much benefit since the County only receives 55% with the other 45% divided to other jurisdictions. It was noted the current Jail Sales Tax one-fourth of one cent reduces to one-eighth of one cent in 2026. Elliot expressed voters tend to vote in favor of tax ballot items when specific items are identified for the tax income; vague language achieves more "no" votes. Elliot reviewed how to educate people about an issue without violating the law stating that Elected Officials cannot advocate or support the issue in their official capacity. Munsterman reviewed the need for additional staffing (School Resource Officers-SRO, investigators) and additional salaries for existing officers, maintenance, and road deputies. Munsterman requested to change the word "department" to "office" and include wording in the ballot language "but not limited to" as stated in the explanation of the ballot language. Commissioner Kavanaugh motioned to approve the ORDER OF THE COUNTY COMMISSION OF JOHNSON COUNTY, MISSOURI, Commissioner Marr seconded. Motion approved unanimously. WHEREAS, § 67.547, RSMo authorizes the governing body of a county to impose a county sales tax on all sales which are subject to taxation under the provisions of §§ 144.010 to 144.525, RSMo.; and WHEREAS, § 67.547, RSMo provides that the tax authorized by that section shall be in addition to any and all other sales tax allowed by law, except that no ordinance or order imposing a sales tax shall be effective unless the governing body of the county submits to the voters of the county, at a county or state general, primary or special election, a proposal to authorize the governing body of the county to impose a tax; and WHEREAS, the County Commission of Johnson County, Missouri, has determined and does now find and determine that a ballot question shall be submitted to the voters of the county to authorize imposition of a county sales tax on all sales which are subject to taxation under §§144.010 to 144.525, RSMo for the purpose of providing funding and to support current and future operations of the Sheriff's Office and Jail; and WHEREAS, the County Commission desires to submit a proposal in the form of a ballot question to the voters of Johnson County, Missouri, at the general municipal election, to be held on April 2, 2019, authorizing the County Commission of Johnson County, Missouri, to impose a county sales tax of one-half of one percent pursuant to § 67.547, RSMo for the purpose of providing funding to support current and future operations of the Sheriff's Office and Jail, including but not limited to staffing levels, personnel compensation and benefits, capital improvements and repairs, equipment costs, and general operations; and WHEREAS, in the event a majority of the votes cast on the proposal by the qualified voters voting thereon are in favor of the proposal, then the county sales tax which is the subject of this Order shall be imposed and in effect; NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AND ORDERED BY THE COUNTY COMMISSION OF JOHNSON COUNTY, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

1. Order of County Commission. The Johnson County Commission hereby orders submission of the following ballot question to the voters of Johnson County, Missouri, at the general municipal election, to be held April 2, 2019, to authorize the County Commission to impose a county sales tax pursuant to § 67.547, RSMo:

PROPOSITION P

"Shall Johnson County impose a countywide sales tax of one-half (1/2) of one percent (1%), for the purpose of providing funding to support current and future operations of the Sheriff's Office and Jail to include but not limited to staffing levels, improved personnel compensation and benefits, capital improvements and equipment costs?"

- 2. Notice and Publication. The Johnson County Commission requests the Clerk of Johnson County, Missouri, and the County Clerk is authorized and directed to take all actions necessary and appropriate to provide proper notice of election and publication of the notice of election regarding the ballot question described in paragraph 1, above.
- 3. Conduct of Election. The election shall be held and conducted by the County Clerk of Johnson County, Missouri, under the general election laws governing the County, on April 2, 2019, at the polling places designated, or hereafter designated for each precinct in the County by order or orders of the County Clerk of Johnson County, Missouri, and that the polls of the election shall be opened and kept open on that day during the hours required by law. The election shall be conducted by the judges and clerks appointed or to be appointed by the County Clerk of Johnson County, Missouri, who shall supply the judges and clerks with all necessary voting equipment, machines, ballot boxes, poll books, tally sheets, and other supplies and equipment required for the conduct of the election, and that the ballot to be used in voting upon the proposition shall be in substantially the form set forth in paragraph 1, above.
- 4. Legal Effect. This Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage. In the event a majority of the votes cast on the proposal described in paragraph 1 by the qualified voters voting thereon are in favor of the proposal, then the county sales tax which is the subject of this Order shall be imposed and in effect.

Also discussed was potential implementation of Global Positioning System (ankle bracelets) for prisoners as determined by a judge versus prisoners being held in a detention facility tabled until February 5, 2019.

The Commissioners met with Brian Bremer, Murphy Tractor and Equipment Company to discuss the purchase of a motor grader. Bremer stated the motor grader would be delivered between 60 days and 90 days from the purchase. Also present was Gary Bell, Road and Bridge Supervisor.

Commissioner Kavanaugh motioned and Commissioner Marr seconded to purchase and authorize Presiding Commissioner Gabel to sign all required documents for the purchase of a John Deere 770G Motor Grader with the John Deere Extended Warranty (84 month/7000 Hour Comprehensive Warranty) for the state bid price of \$242,246.00 with Bridge Construction funds from Murphy Tractor and Equipment Company. Pabst further explained all of the counties that have both CERF and LAGERS all began had LAGERS at the time CERF was created and then also joined CERF. At this time, 82 Missouri counties have LAGERS with some of those counties also have CERF. Thompson reviewed that many of County Clerks reported significant benefits from having retirement benefits of both CERF and LAGERS. Commissioner Kavanaugh stated that the Commissioners do not have anticipated decision date and may not move forward with the cost assessment.

Fees received in January, 2019 from Stormy Taylor, Recorder of Deeds were approved. Fees deposited with the Treasurer were \$24,868.50.

The Commissioners received copies of a letter of recognition from the Johnson County Economic Development Corporation to David Streeter, Johnson County Public Water Supply #3.

The Commissioners received notice from Anne L. Precythe, Department of Corrections Director and Dick Burke, Missouri Association of Counties Executive Director regarding Alternative Jail Sanction. The letter informed the Commission that the Governor's fiscal year 2020 budget recommendation includes a request to transfer the \$5,000,000 appropriation for the Alternative Jail Sanction Program back to the Jail Reimbursements Appropriation. With the Governor's recommendation, the department will not be processing Alternative Jail Sanction reimbursement requests or proposals in the current fiscal year but should result in additional Jail Reimbursement Funds. It was further noted the implementation of the Alternative Jail Reimbursement would not have decreased the Jail Reimbursement requests and ultimately would have led to even larger shortfalls in the Jail Reimbursement appropriation. The Commissioners stated there would still be value in meeting with Dave Young of BI Incorporated on February 5, 2019 regarding the Global Positioning System (ankle bracelets) for prisoners.

Furthermore, 205.330 RMSo, "the board of hospital trustees shall have power to determine whether or not patients presented at said public hospital for treatment are subjects for charity, and shall fix such price for compensation for patients, other than those unable to assist themselves, as the said board deems proper, the receipts therefor to be paid to the treasurer of said county and credited by him to the hospital fund."

Young reviewed equipment for the client which relays information through satellites, Verizon and Sprint cell towers. Each customer has their own log in with client information, the customer can ping the The equipment is available for purchase or rent. Purchase would be around \$1,800 per device in addition to the monitoring fee (approximately \$2.00). For rent and monitoring the estimated cost is \$4.50 per unit per day. Cut off typically occurs with juvenile, the ankle bracelet can send an alert. And an insurance policy (20% lost or damaged) would be purchased to allow for some of the units to be damaged. The straps are replaceable. Per day rental plus monitor fee includes straps, annual cleaning at BI.

Communicate up to 12 satellites, 4-5 feet to 90 feet. Bracelets are required to be able to be cut off with household scissors due to potential medical issues. The straps include fiber optic signal through the band and if fiber optic signal is broken, an alert is sent to the Customer.

Geo fences can be set by the Customer and then can announce the location. Geo fences can be shared to not repeat duplicate work. When the Client is home, there is a beacon.

They do not work well underground, under water (8-9 feet), and in some buildings

Customers are notified by text message or email to officers and or call centers of a client that has broken their parole policies. Multiple reports are available and customer support is available to help the customer Smaller counties typically use the program for those with extreme medical concerns.

Blood Alcohol Content Testing – testing occurs 5-6 times per day approximately \$5.00-\$6.00 per unit per day with monitoring, charging is done like a cell phone. The monitoring includes facial recognition, GPS, requires the client to have an operating smart phone.

Next steps: County to identify the estimated number of units for active use and "on deck" and schedule a demo.

The Commissioners attended County Commissioners Association of Missouri Annual Training on Wednesday, February 6, 2019 through Friday, February 8, 2019 at the Holiday Inn Executive Center in Columbia, Missouri. Also present was Gary Bell, Road and Bridge Supervisor. The Commissioners reported options from Travis Elliott, Ellis, Ellis, Hammons & Johnson, P. C. regarding the vacation of a road and/or bridge which would potentially landlock a property (specific issue NW 21st Road/Post Oak Creek). Elliot stated the County has the following options:

- County repair the road and / or bridge
- County can do nothing
- County can close the bridge and vacate that section of the road according to statue requirements Elliot further explained if the County closes or vacates the bridge and / or road, it is the responsibility of the land owners to get easements and / or right of ways from other land owners. Elliot also stated the County may identify the weight-restrictions on roads and bridges to maintain safe crossings. Commissioner Gabel addressed the concern of the land owners potentially suing the County. The Commissioners discussed the importance of adequate communication with property owners of no further maintenance of the road and / or bridge. Bell stated the Road and Bridge Department can post signs, and wait for the inspector to say when a bridge is safe.

Commissioner Gabel reported from Troy Armstrong, Emergency Management Agency Director, the heat on the main floor of their offices at 122 Hout Street was not working on February 9, 2019 but the heat was working on the lower and upper levels of the building. Armstrong did not allow Henry County to use the large generator due to the similar winter weather impact; Armstrong encouraged Henry County to contact Bates County due to the county not having a similar impact. Armstrong flew out on February 10, 2019 to Federal Emergency Management Agency training.

The Commissioners reviewed data from Columbia Parks and Recreation (per the suggestion of David Curtis on February 5, 2019) regarding the various types of trail surfaces and estimated annual maintenance cost for one-quarter (1/4) of a mile. Also present was Gary Bell, Road and Bridge Supervisor. Columbia's estimated costs were based on a few years ago (according to Gabe Huffington, Park Services Manager):

Concrete: \$894Asphalt: \$2,601

- Gravel (in non washout/flood areas): \$1,584
- Gravel (in washout/flood areas): \$5,071

Bell stated the cost of maintenance for gravel repairs in washout/flood areas is underestimated for the Spirit Trail considering the base material. It was noted that many of the trails in Columbia are on vacated train routes and therefore already have an established foundation. Marr estimated the distance for the recently completed Spirit Trail at four and one quarter (4 ¼) miles.

The monthly report of monies received in January, 2019 by Diane Thompson, County Clerk was approved. Deposited with the Treasurer was \$108.25.

Included in the bills was invoices in the amount of \$7,594.00 from Dennis Boling for the relocation of the generator from the courthouse to the County Barn. Upon further investigation, Gary Bell, Road and Bridge Supervisor, reported that it was his understanding that Boling would be doing the work and to coordinate with him on getting the generator moved. He was unaware that the bill would exceed the \$6,000 threshold. Bell indicated he would review the bill in question tomorrow (Friday, February 15th).

The Commissioners met with Joanne Mahurin and Connie Beach to discuss NW 25th Road beginning at NW 1021st Road and proceeding West in Section 19 of Township 46 North, Range 27 West. Mahurin indicated that former Commissioner Bob Banes agreed to close the section of the road past Mahurin's driveway in the mid-1990's. The County Clerk's office searched minutes and road records to find no indication of a road closing or road vacation. Commissioner Kavanaugh stated that one commissioner cannot act alone to close a road. Thompson reviewed the difference between vacated roads and abandoned roads as well as the process for vacating a road. Commissioner Gabel identified the maintaining of a road can be as minimal as driving past the road and viewing the road. Commissioner Kavanaugh asked Mahurin to identify the problem with the NW 25th Road being maintained by the County. Mahurin requested that the portion of the road be closed from her property and continuing West. Beach stated she does not want to cut off access to the property owners. Commissioner Marr stated the road was established and is platted in the 1952 Johnson County Plat Book. The Commissioners reviewed the instructions given to the Road and Bridge Department regarding NW 25th Road: to maintain the road by placing gravel and keeping the existing roadway of 8 feet, 5 inches passable, no removal of fences or trees. Mahurin requested that nothing be done until she has an opportunity to talk to Mark Reynolds, Assessor, regarding the change in legal descriptions that reflect the easements and a site visit of the road can be made by the Commissioners. The Commissioners agreed to that and will follow up with Mahurin and Beach on a date to meet at the property.

The Commissioners reviewed, approved and signed the Johnson County-Spirit Trail STP 6300 (406) GRE Project 3161.01 Final Documents. The Commissioners discussed the probability of James Bentley with Missouri Department of Transportation (MoDOT) needing additional documents after their review however Great Rivers Engineering (GRE) prepared the final documents in the hope that additional documents are not needed from MoDOT.

The Commissioners met with Danielle Bush and Pat Smith regarding road maintenance for Village Lake North and South. Village Lake North and South are now one subdivision. The two properties along D Highway with the subdivision monuments offers some opportunity for drainage back to D Hwy. That may require approval from MoDOT. Gary Bell will look to see what his suggestion is for the drainage improvement. If an NID is utilized for drainage and road improvements, engineering costs occur upfront (paid by escrow account or property owners). The Commissioners suggested working with the property owners of Villages of Whitmen on a combined or coordinated Neighborhood Improvement District for drainage and road surface for Villages at Whiteman. The Commissioners will contact Gary Bell, Road and Bridge Supervisor, to review the current drainage and road surface situation at Village Lake. Bush and Smith took the NID questionnaire to review with their upcoming Homeowners Association meeting.

The Commissioners discussed the Counties Compensation Time Policy, reviewed in 2017 with a memorandum sent but no action taken to reduce comp time. The Commissioners released the following regarding Reporting of Work Time and Comp Time to Elected Officials and Department Heads: In reviewing the county budget as well as policies and procedures for exempt and non-exempt employees that are currently in practice, we wish to address certain payroll matters with all office holders and department heads. The County is at great risk with the comp time liability. We are seeking the assistance of all office holders and department heads with this matter.

Reporting Work Time:

With the exception of attorneys, both exempt and non-exempt employees must record their work hours as directed and have them approved by their manager before they forward to payroll. These employees, regardless of salary or hourly status, shall complete a time card and submit it to the supervising office holder for signed approval. Salaried employees accrue sick and vacation at the same rate as hourly employees and shall report used sick and/or vacation time accordingly.

Maximum Comp Time Accrual:

Currently, the maximum amount of comp time that can be accrued is 100 hours of pay eligibility. Any employee who accrues more than 100 hours will be paid overtime according to FLSA regulations for all hours worked over 40 in a work week.

The Commission has voted to reduce the maximum amount of comp time accrued to 80 hours by December 13, 2019. We are asking all elected officials and department heads who have employees with more than the current maximum of 100 hours to encourage the use of additional hours.

The Commission is also recommending phasing comp time down to the desired amount of 80 hours through two target dates. Effective July 1, 2019 (for the check paid on July 18), the maximum amount of comp time that can be accrued be reduced to 100 hours. Effective December 13, 2019 (for the check paid on December 19), the maximum amount of comp time that can be accrued be reduced to 80 hours. Any employee having more than 80 hours be paid out for any hours over 80 on the last check of the 2019 budget year. Please contact HR for current comp time liability so that amount can be factored into your budget. We are open to discussing any budget concerns you have to accomplish this goal.

We appreciate your continued support in maintaining reasonable and fiscally sound liability level in the County.

Commissioner Kavanaugh motioned to proceed with the bid invitation for the Johnson County Sheriff Patrol Vehicles; there was no second to the motion. Motion failed. The Commissioners tabled the discussion.

The Commissioners with Dan Ewing regarding his planned retirement and the plans for his replacement.

The Commissioners discussed The Preserve, also known as Twin Oaks, roads were accepted by the County as gravel roads August 8, 2017. Tye stated the County Road and Bridge Department put the first layer of chip and seal on the road in 2018; it was noted that a hard surface road petition was not completed and the money (\$22,094.81) for the double chip and seal work was delivered to the Road and Bridge Department which was to be submitted to the Treasurer. The single layer of chip and seal is to be completed by the Road and Bridge Department in 2019 after the Homeowner's Association submits \$8,884.75 payment to the County Clerk's office for processing.

The Commissioners reviewed the decision made on July 30, 2018 to begin annual subdivision payments to The Preserves also known as Twin Oaks (SE 971st Road, SE 981st Road, SE 991st Road, SE 380th Road, SE 390th Road) in 2019 but the work was not completed and the full payment for the road work was not completed in 2018.

Commissioner Kavanaugh motioned and Commissioner Marr seconded to amend the July 30, 2018 decision to withhold annual subdivision payments until the road work is complete and the full payments have been made to the County. Motion approved unanimously.

The Commissioners met with Rick Squiric, representing the Greater Area Warrensburg Chamber of Commerce for Membership Recruitment. Also present was Mark Reynolds, Assessor; Heather Reynolds, Treasurer; Brent Teichman, Associate Circuit Judge; Troy Armstrong, Emergency Management Agency Director. Squiric presented the Gold Sponsor Membership available to the County at a reduced rate of \$2,500 for membership of 16 County Elected Officials and / or Directors through October 1, 2019. Squiric noted the Presiding Commissioner obtains an honorary membership.

Commissioner Kavanaugh motioned and Commissioner Marr seconded to proceed with the \$2,500.00 Warrensburg Chamber of Commerce 2019 Membership through October 1, 2019 as a trial basis. Motion passed unanimously.

Judge Brent Teichman reported that he now oversees Drug Court. Teichman reviewed the current \$25,000 budget with some graduates through the program as it was overseen by Judge Collins. Adriatik Likcani through the Recovery Lighthouse and is now certified counselor. SAMHSA - Substance Abuse & Mental Health Services Administration Grant request has been approved for \$2,000,000 with funding available May 31, 2019 and runs annually upon approval for \$400,000 per year for five (5) years. Twelve (12) participants currently in Drug Court. Teichman reported that the program must maintain 40 participants annually to maintain the grant requirements. The program requires a minimum of 14 months of participation but some participants take longer to complete the program. Teichman anticipates three (3) or four (4) graduates this summer with five (5) or six (6) waiting for approval to join the program.

The Commissioners met with Stephen Mukembo regarding a few questions from the University of Missouri Extension Office "Community Assessment Guiding Questions" so he can know how to support Johnson County. Also present was Tracy Brantner, Johnson County Economic Development Director. The Commission encouraged Mukembo to become involved with current and upcoming projects within Johnson County to support the work being done. Brantner reviewed that Johnson County Economic Development Corporation does not have the capacity at this time to support small business entrepreneurship; additional funds and resources (time and talent) would be required to proceed. Brantner stated primary employment doesn't need the help with marketing like the small business requires.

The Commissioners discussed the implementation of the SecureTech Instant Notification System (panic buttons). Also present: Judge Brent Teichman, Collector Ruthane Small, Recorder Stormy Taylor, Treasurer Heather Reynolds, and Emergency Management Agency Director Troy Armstrong. Commissioner Gabel asked Small about the security system at the South Annex; Small stated that Night Watch provides the camera system and door lock system but additional costs would apply if a security system is needed. The Commissioners requested an updated quote from SecureTech Systems adding the South Annex (remote receiver and two single button duress alrms), Small to obtain a quote for a LAN drop to be set up in the Justice Center or Courthouse and a standalone quote for the Night Watch Security System. The payment for implementation could be done through the budget's special projects line item. Discussion tabled until April 23, 2019.

The Commissioners met with Troy Armstrong, for the Emergency Management Agency (EMA) Bi-Weekly Update. Armstrong review the report bringing attention to the following:

- Household Hazardous Waste April 20, 2019 Collection had reduced numbers due to ongoing collections by EMA staff throughout the year upon request.
- City of Knob Noster will no longer manage their own central dispatch; Armstrong reviewed assistance provided during their transition.
- August Full Scale Search and Rescue Exercise 8/3 (permit required from the State)
- Local Emergency Planning and Committee (LEPC) Drone for with thermal camera and speaker. Armstrong reviewed the cost for insurance, local insurance company was \$3,400 per year with a drone specific provider \$700 per year insurance includes civil liability and terrorism. Armstrong is meeting with Sheriff and Fire Department Warrensburg as they have expressed interest in involvement. Lorenz also discussed maintenance done by the County on NE 950th Road to which Lorenz requested the County regraded the road and reestablish ditches.

WHEREAS, the Johnson County Commission adopted the Code of Health Regulations for Onsite Wastewater Treatment Systems which became effective April 9, 2006; and, WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 3.2.9 of the Code of Health Regulations (Appeals Panel), the County Commission shall appoint an appeals panel consisting of three members for the purpose of reviewing violation complaints upon request of the property occupant or owner; and, WHEREAS, Thomas Craig's appointment expired December 31, 2018; and, WHEREAS, Mr. Craig has agreed to serve another three year term; and, NOW, THEREFORE, the Johnson County Commission hereby reappoints Thomas Craig to a three-year term retroactively effective January 1, 2019 and expiring December 31, 2021.

The Commissioners met with Gary Bell, Road and Bridge Supervisor, regarding ongoing road and bridge projects. Specifically discussed was the recent maintenance of NE 950th Road beginning at 13 Highway and proceeding East; Lorenz Richter reported excessive grading of the road which created additional washboards and potholes and removed established ditches. Bell will review the road and note the road is expected to have gravel placed.

The Commissioners received correspondence from Diane Thompson acknowledging that Sheriff Munsterman being victim of a scam that caused Munsterman's paycheck to be redirected through a fraudulent direct deposit scam. The Honorable Johnson County Commission met this day pursuant to adjournment. Present: Bill Gabel, Presiding Commissioner; John Marr, Eastern Commissioner; and Diane Thompson, County Clerk. Not Present: Charles Kavanaugh, Western Commissioner. The following proceedings were had to-wit:

Accounts payable in the amount of \$228,312.10 was reviewed and approved for payment.

Fees received in April, 2019 from Stormy Taylor, Recorder of Deeds were approved. Fees deposited with the Treasurer were \$30,139.70.

Commissioner Gabel and Commissioner Marr met with Jim Ash and Dan Ewing, Building and Grounds. Ewing presented City Electric proposal to change out the Courthouse florescent lights to LED lights using the existing fixtures with only a modification of a wire and requires no ballast. Ewing stated the initial investment to replace all the bulbs in the courthouse is approximately \$4,000. Commissioner Gabel and Commissioner Marr authorized Ewing and Ash to proceed with the purchase, modification and installation of the current Courthouse florescent lights to LED lights with the estimated cost of \$4,000. The replacement will be done in work spaces prior to office opening; hallways and lesser used areas during office hours.

The Commissioners met with Stephen Muembo, Allison Bolt, and Billie Winter for University of Missouri Extension Council monthly update.

Commissioner Gabel and Commissioner Marr met with Gary Bell, Road and Bridge Supervisor; regarding effects from the rain storms on April 30, 2019 and flooding damage on May 1, 2019. Discussion included the need for the County to repair and / or replace SW 151st Road (by NW 900th) due to very poor condition. Bell stated the bridge needs to be fixed quickly and waiting for the State may take too long; however, if the bridge is engineered it would count as soft match with Missouri Department of Transportation (MoDOT). - 3. MoDOT does repair and / or replacement.

Bell stated Road and Bridge Department has sufficient supplies and budget to be able to complete the work if that is decision.

Commissioner Gabel and Commissioner Marr met with Dennis Boling regarding the hard surface petition of NW 361st Road beginning at NW 200th Road and proceeding 0.667 mile to the north side of the Boling driveway in Section 8, Township 46 North, Range 25 West. Total project cost is estimated at \$41,129.12 and valid if paid in full by May 31, 2019. Boling stated University of Central Missouri will provide \$10,000.00 for the project because they own a large section of the frontage area. Boling submitted the Dead End Road Hard Surface Petition to the County Clerk along with \$31,129.12 payment. The Commissioners tabled discussion until full payment has been made for the project.

A Proclamation Declaring National Stop the Bleed Day in Johnson County, Missouri WHEREAS, the top cause of preventable death due to trauma is bleeding, and 20 percent of people who have died from traumatic injuries could have survived with quick bleeding control; and WHEREAS, anyone, from professional rescuers to the average person, can administer simple medical care that stops hemorrhaging, and easy-to-use resources are available; and WHEREAS, Johnson County is joining the national Stop the Bleed campaign by raising awareness and offering lifesaving training at no cost to citizens; and WHEREAS, National Stop the Bleed Day brings bleeding control instructors and students together for a day of training; and WHEREAS, when it comes to emergency bleeding control, every second counts. The purpose of Stop the Bleed campaign is to provide emergency bleeding training for all and to provide the tools needed to save a life. NOW THEREFORE, be it proclaimed by the Johnson County Commission that May 23rd, 2019 is National Stop the Bleed Day in Johnson County, Missouri. Furthermore, the Commission commends the men and women within Johnson County's interagency partnership and their collaborative efforts to educate the public about this important topic.

The Commissioners reviewed and approved minutes from the previous weeks.

The Commissioners discussed the State Bid Purchase Sheriff Vehicles. Commissioner Kavanaugh contacted Kelly Sells, Joe Machens Ford, regarding pricing for the County's potential purchase of four (4) Ford Police Interceptor Utility All Wheel Drive from the Missouri State Bid (Contract Number: CC190367002) It was determined that the price (\$33,482) in the State Bid was only valid for Missouri Highway Patrol Vehicles and the county's price per vehicle would be slightly higher (\$34,190). Thompson later clarified, after discussing the matter with Missouri Office of Administration, the additional fee (if stated in the contract) would be applicable to county purchases and if the County desired to use the State Bid to purchase the police interceptor, the County would need to use Lou Fusz as stated in the bid documents. Thompson further clarified that each vehicle has the awarded bidder listed on the state bid and the approved bidder is only applicable to the specific bid/vehicle to which they were approved.

The Commissioners did not conduct a bid opening for the Johnson County Road and Bridge - Road Oil Storage Tanks due to no bids being received by the deadline. The Commission determined to seek individual quotes to proceed with the purchase of the two (2) road oil storage tanks.

Commissioner Gabel and Commissioner Marr met with Tom Buttram regarding the hard surface road quote listed on the petition for SE 281st Road in Shawnee Trace subdivision; also present was Gary Bell, Road and Bridge Supervisor. Buttram requested to reduce the County work done and price to the road to only include the double chip and seal (no reclaiming, prime base work, stabilization or third chip and seal). Commissioner Marr stated if the County is going to do the work, the whole process will be completed and if Buttram only wants a chip and seal done without stabilization he will need to contract a vendor to do the work. Commissioner Gabel stated the road would not hold up (likely only two [2] years) without the proper process. Buttram stated his understanding and indicated the road was in good enough shape that it would not need stabilization; he asked to proceed with the double chip and seal. Buttram reviewed that he has already chip and sealed the road once. Commissioner Marr reviewed two (2) property owners have discussed the matter and their concerns with the Commission. Buttram reviewed work completed in 2018 to bring the road up to specifications to be able to have SW 281st Road accepted by the County as a gravel road. The Commissioners reviewed that the County will not do the chip and seal work without the grinding, base work, prime oil, and stabilization. Buttram stated that roads can go bad with stabilization or without and he has made SW 281st Road a good, sound road. Bell and the Commissioners reviewed the cost breakdown and stated that the third layer of chip and seal can be removed from the scope of work at Buttram's request, but that they didn't recommend it. Buttram stated that is what he wished to do and he only wanted to pay for a double chip and seal. The Commissioners approved to modify the project to remove the work and the cost of the third layer of chip and seals for an adjusted price of \$23,451.11. The Commissioners stated that Buttram would be responsible to explain the reduced road surface project to the property owners. The Commissioners reviewed that the petition must be completed and submitted before payment may be turned in to the County Clerk and the payment must be received by May 31, 2019 for the pricing to be valid and the project to be completed in 2019. Buttram indicated he was agreeable to the reduced price and reduced work. Buttram was given an updated petition to complete.

Having reviewed the Governor's decision to extend the Independence Day holiday to include Friday, July 5, 2019 for all state employees, Commissioner Gabel stated that after discussion between the Commissioners Johnson County, Missouri will not observe July 5, 2019 as a holiday. Reynolds recommended that the board forward this appeal onto the State Tax Commission as it is business personal property and it is related to the appeal from 2018 that has not been decided. Jerome Wallach, The Wallach Law Firm, submitted an appeal for **Wal-Mart Store #61, 301 E Cooper Ave, Warrensburg.** The appeal form gave a recommended market value as of January 1, 2019 of \$5,064,925. The Assessor lists the market value at \$8,173,544 and assessed value at \$2,615,534. No one was present at the hearing on behalf of Wal-Mart or the Wallach Law Firm. No supporting documentation was presented with the appeal form. The reason stated was "overvaluation". Based on the lack of substantiating documentation, Reynolds recommended that the value be kept at the current amount. Kavanaugh moved and Carper seconded to uphold the current assessed value. The motion passed unanimously.

College Town Apartments, 412 S. Main, Warrensburg, represented by Flanagan/Bilton, Chicago, IL were present to submit their appeal. They are requesting a reduction in value from \$2,584,382 (\$38,006 per unit) to \$1,987.447 (\$29,227 per unit). Upon review of the documentation submitted, it was noted by Carper (realtor) and Raines (appraiser) that most of the comps submitted were for properties in Kansas City and St. Joseph. The only Warrensburg comp was at 303 W. Young (Electric Springs Apartments), which is considerably older than and about half the size of the 412 S. Main St. property. Carper noted 1205 S. Holden, built in 1976, recently sold for \$1,150,000 (\$48,000 per unit). Kavanaugh moved and Marr seconded to uphold the current assessed value. The motion passed unanimously

Reynolds recommended that the BOE close as there are no other appointments scheduled. Following discussion on the recommendation, Kavanaugh moved and Marr seconded to close the Board of Equalization. The motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

Commissioner Kavanaugh motioned and Commissioner Marr seconded to approve Ordinance - Reducing Speed Limit on Section of Business 13 Highway in Section 12 and 13 of Township 46 North, Range 26 WHEREAS, the Johnson County Commission acknowledges the City of Warrensburg constructed a roundabout at Hawthorne Boulevard and Business 13 Highway in Section 12 of Township 46 North, Range 26 West in Johnson County, Missouri; and, WHEREAS, the Johnson County Commission received a request from the City of Warrensburg to reduce the speed limit from 55 miles per hour to 35 miles per hour on Business 13 Highway beginning at NE 175th Road and NW 175th Road and proceeding North 1,100 feet in Sections 12 and 13, Township 46 North, and Range 26 West, all in Johnson County; and, WHEREAS, the Johnson County Commission desires to maintain safe driving conditions and, NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNTY COMMISSION OF JOHNSON COUNTY, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS: Section 1. That no person shall operate a motor vehicle on Business 13 Highway beginning at NE 175th Road and NW 175th Road and proceeding North 1,100 feet in excess of 35 miles per hour in Sections 12 and 13, Township 46 North, and Range 26 West, all in Johnson County.

Section 2. The maximum speed of 35 miles per hour shall be posted on said roadways described in Section 1. Section 3. Pursuant to 304.010 RSMo, violations of county speed limit ordinances are established in Section 304.010.11 RSMo.

Section 4. That this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval. Passed and approved by the County Commission of Johnson County, this 29th day of August, 2019.

The Commissioners met with Highway Patrol Sargent Green requesting the County maintain the high traffic thorough fares in and around Warrensburg - specifically Business Route 13 from the north roundabout to the north Warrensburg city limits and from the south city limits to the south roundabout; NE 200 Road (formerly HH Hwy) north of the Dollar General Warehouse and East Division Road from Warrensburg city limits to the Hwy 13 Bypass. Also present was Gary Bell, Road and Bridge Department Supervisor; Slim Coleman, City of Warrensburg; Sara Larson, Daily Star Journal. Sargent Green explained the accident from 2018 regarding his patrol vehicle and an inexperienced 16 year old driver that hit a patch of ice on the untreated bridge on Business Route 13 north of Warrensburg. The sport utility vehicle (SUV) driven by the 16 year old rear ended the Highway Patrol vehicle and flipped over the top of it. The County-maintained roads and bridges had not been pretreated or treated but the State and Warrensburg roads and bridges were pretreated and treated with the predicted weather. Sargent Green stated that if he knew a problem existed and if nothing was done, then he and the department would be responsible in the event of an accident. Green reviewed previous traffic studies with daily traffic over 8,600 vehicles traveling North Business Route 13 and because of the large amount of traffic the County needs to take action as perceived by Green. Green acknowledged there is a cost involved to maintain roads during winter weather but in consideration of the County's liability, the cost may not be seen as great in comparison.

Green requested the County pretreat the high traffic roads and bridges (as determined by a traffic count) when winter weather is predicted with salt similar to MoDOT's process, to reduce or delay the freezing process as much as possible. Green stated it will be the County's responsibility receive calls and close County maintained roads if the roads are not deemed safe for traffic.

Road and Bridge Supervisor, Gary Bell, indicated that spreaders and loaders are available, but there is currently no place to store the salt with consideration of run-off.

Commissioner Gabel stated he is not opposed to work with everyone but will not adopt an ordinance. Gabel stated Road and Bridge Supervisor, Gary Bell, should be the only person to make the decision of what roads to be treated and in the manner they are to be treated. Gabel stated that many people have a feeling that the government will take care of you no matter what and that is the wrong way to think about these things. Commissioner Kavanaugh stated drivers are not notified when they enter the county maintained sections of roads that the bridge and / or road is not pre-treated or treated and that lack of communication can lead to unsafe driving conditions since the previous section of road was pretreated or treated. Kavanaugh stated his request to have the County Road and Bridge Department to pretreat roads and treat roads as requested by Sargent Green. Kavanaugh stated the Road and Bridge Department needs guidelines set by the Commission has set so the responsibility is not on the Road and Bridge Department to explain why some roads are maintained differently. Commissioner Kavanaugh stated his desire is to see the County pretreat and maintain roads during winter weather conditions for the safety of motorists. Commissioner Kavanaugh stated if the County is willing to invest in asphalting the Spirit Trail so people can walk and bike a trail, then the County needs to keep the high traffic roadways safe.

Coleman stated there is an economic factor to consider if roads are impassable, businesses will be closed, residents will not travel and then revenue would not be collected. The motoring public has expectations to be able to travel on safe roadways. Coleman offered the City of Warrensburg's services to assist with training or ideas on storage or any other needs.

Commissioner Kavanaugh motioned for the Road and Bridge Supervisor to use salt, sand, beet juice or any combination of products to prepare for winter weather and maintain safe road conditions for main thoroughfares with high traffic. There was no second was made or official vote of the Commission. When Commissioner Kavanaugh requested a response the following was given:

- Commissioner Gabel stated he wanted the Road Supervisor to make the decision on products used to maintain the roads but did not want to put a formal policy in writing.
- Commissioner Marr stated he did not want to put a formal policy in writing and did not want to start using salt products on the roads.

The Commissioners met with Jeannie Cunningham, Mike Keith Insurance, regarding the health insurance coverage for 2020. Also present were Diane Thompson, County Clerk; Lisa Shore, Human Resources Director; Stormy Taylor, Recorder of Deeds; Heather Reynolds, Treasurer; Tracy Brantner, JCEDC Executive Director, Lindsay Rankin, Public Administrator office and Babette Sproat, R&B office. Cunningham presented two plans from Lifestyle Health plans - the First Health network the county currently uses and a PAN network option. The current First Health network would renew at a 20.53% increase (\$1,432,350.60 compared to the current cost of \$1,188,396.12). The PAN network would have a renewal rate of \$1,339,245.60, or a 12.69% increase. Cunningham noted that she submitted the coverage request and claims history for county employees to five other carriers to compare coverage costs. Aetna, BCBSKC, Cigna and United Health Care declined to quote as they could not offer a competitive rate. Humana submitted a quote of \$1,796,055.36 or a 51.13% increase over our current costs. The Commission rejected Humana's bid as uncompetitive as well. Cunningham explained that with the PAN network there is a prescheduling procedure for hospital and outpatient procedures. This allows for negotiating of the cost of the procedure and eliminates the balance bill scenario. Commissioner Kavanaugh moved and Commissioner Marr seconded to take the matter under advisement. Shore will provide additional cost comparisons for each of the deductibles offered for Commission consideration.

The Commissioners held a preconstruction meeting with Mark Huck, Burns & McDonnell and Cale Seymour, Cale Seymour Construction, on BRO-B051(39) on SW 1871 over Big Creek.

The Honorable Johnson County Commission met this day pursuant to adjournment. Present: Bill Gabel, Presiding Commissioner; John Marr, Eastern Commissioner; Charles Kavanaugh, Western Commissioner; and Diane Thompson, County Clerk. The following proceedings were had to-wit:

The Commissioners approved wage continuation for an employee from the Road and Bridge Department.

The Commissioners reviewed and signed the reimbursement request to Greater Kansas City Community Foundation for reimbursement a total of \$400 for the one (1) indigent cremations that have been conducted April 12, 2019 through October 25, 2019.

Emergency purchase of replacement furnace at Jail for \$13,650 from Dennis Boling. A second bid was received from Get'er Done HVACR LLC in the amount of \$13,733.00 with a product availability of 7-10 business from bid award and installation 7-12 days from bid award.

The Commissioners met with Troy Armstrong for the Emergency Management Agency (EMA) Bi-Weekly Update, also present was Shane Lockard, Johnson County Ambulance District (JCAD) Chief. Armstrong presented the bi-weekly report and discussed the potential move of EMA offices to the unoccupied portion of 263 SE State Route 13, Warrensburg, Missouri. Lockard encouraged the EMA to move out of the current facility as it is not a functional emergency operation center (EOC). Lockard reviewed the location needs to have communication functionality (accessibility to radio access, phone lines, data jacks, etc.) since EOCs are hubs for events that require the gathering of multiple agencies requiring additional space, parking and security. Lockard reviewed that emergency agencies prepare for "When not IF." Lockard reviewed JCAD is not looking to profit from a sale of the property and JCAD is not ready to sell the property at this time as it utilizes the lower level of the building and the apparatus Bay Area. JCAD is suggesting the County lease with the option to purchase. Discussion tabled.

Shane Lockard presented a Resolution for Johnson County E-911 Board to Opt in to the 3% Prepaid Cell Phone Tax per paragraph 6 of 190.460.7 RSMo, Lockard noted that the funds would go toward a state wide enhanced 911 system that Johnson County E911 could benefit from going forward. The updates would build in a redundancy for a statewide system. Matching funds may become available and without opting in to the 3% tax on prepaid cell phone, Johnson could miss out on those funds. Lockard explained this was a "911 fix" to clarify language from the 2018 bill that the county had previously "opted out" of and their attorney agrees. Kavanaugh asked about a deadline. Lockard noted that it has to be prior to November 15, 2019.

The Commissioners met with Scott Munsterman, Sheriff, to review the current status of buildings and maintenance. Munsterman stated they are not able to accept 30 prisoners due to heater being out of service in A building. Munsterman reviewed that heaters have recently been replaced B building and C building. No action was taken on the heater replacement or repairs. Munsterman stated a freezer went out this weekend as well; Air Design is repairing the freezer.

The Commissioners discussed and reviewed options for 2020 County Employee Health Insurance. Also present was Assessor Mark Reynolds, Recorder Stormy, Auditor Chad, Road and Bridge Supervisor Gary Bell, HR Director Lisa Shore and staff from the Auditor and Public Administrator offices. The Commissioners met to discuss the Employee Group Benefit Plan coverage for 2020. Following discussion, Commissioner Kavanaugh moved and Commissioner Marr seconded to provide the following coverage: three individual/family deductible plans will be available - \$3,000/\$6000, \$3,500/\$7,000 and \$5,000/\$10,000; the county will cover \$695.56/employee/month for all three plans; employees will pay the difference (if any) for their desired coverage as well as the coverage of family members; the county will continue to contribute \$30/month to the \$5000/\$10,000 plan since that premium is only \$665.56 per month. The motion passed unanimously.

The Commission met with Diane Thompson, County Clerk regarding the 2020 budget. Thompson updated the Commission on the emailing of budget requests to elected officials and department heads. Thompson reminded the Commission that there will be 27 pay periods in 2020, with the first being January 2nd. That will require the hearing to adopt the budget to be held the last week of December, 2019.

The Commissioners discussed the lease of Johnson County Ambulance District (JCAD) at 263 SE State Route 13, Warrensburg, Missouri for Johnson County Emergency Management Agency (EMA) Offices; discussion tabled. The Commissioners declined the tour of the JCAD facilities.

The Commissioners met with Gary Bell, Road and Bridge Supervisor, to discuss and review the proposed Johnson County Snow and Ice Removal Control Policy. Commissioner Kavanaugh motioned and Commissioner Marr seconded to approve the County of Johnson, Missouri Snow and Ice Control Policy. Motion approved unanimously.

JOHNSON COUNTY SNOW AND ICE REMOVAL CONTROL POLICY INTRODUCTION

The following policies and procedures serve as a practical guide of the cost-effective snow and ice control in the County of Johnson, Missouri.

MONITORING AND NOTIFICATION OF ICE/SNOW EVENTS

During working hours the observation of the Road and Bridge Department crew may trigger the first crew to response. Resources permitting, first crew response may be two (2) dump trucks with material spreaders. As the need to change crews or add to the crew to begin the removal of actual snow arises, Road and Bridge Department crews may initiate additional crew calls.

Road and Bridge Department personnel will monitor weather reports when inclement weather is approaching. The use of radios, television, and National Weather Service radio may be used in conjunction with on the road observations to determine notification timing.

PRIORITIES

In order to make the most efficient use of available resources; it is necessary to establish priorities using the assumption that the severity of a storm is not beyond the normal capabilities of the County's snow removal resources. Deviations will occur. For example, storm severity may preclude all snow removal operations or seriously impede response or an emergency may require a different allocation of resources.

County of Johnson maintained roads and surfaces are broken up into regions or areas. Each of the areas will be serviced as set forth in the priorities set forth below.

The established priorities:

- 1. Hard Surface roads and hard surface subdivision roads (snow removal may begin at 3 inches of accumulation)
- 2. Gravel roads (after six inches of snow depth or drifting)
- 3. Johnson County Courthouse parking lot and Johnson County Justice Center parking lot
- 4. Sheriff, fire, and rescue calls that need assistance. Such as safe passage through icing or deep snow. In the event of a health, safety, or welfare emergency, this may become a first priority.
- 5. All other roads by efficiency routes as determined necessary.

NOTE: If conditions warrant, material spreading or plowing of any roads may be stopped at any time to return to higher priority roads to re-spread or plow.

EMERGENCIES

- 1. Immediate need for Sheriff, Fire, and Rescue assistance. If Emergency personnel asking for assistance must leave the public right-of-way to respond to an emergency; snow removal crews will provide necessary assistance such as opening a driveway or parking lot to give access to emergency crews.
- 2. Isolated problem areas where traction is urgently needed before all other areas are handled. NOTE: The Sheriff's Department or Highway Patrol may advise of road conditions and shall not direct snow and ice operations of the Johnson County Road and Bridge Department.
- 3. Icing conditions where a waterline break has occurred.

DRIVEWAYS AND PRIVATE PROPERTY PLOWING

Johnson County snow plows will not clear private driveways, private roads or other property, such as parking lots, except in an emergency as previously discussed.

It is the responsibility of the property owner to remove any snow placed on driveways, or sidewalks, or parking lots or any such property by Johnson County snowplows.


MATERIAL SPREADING

Johnson County does not have resources to spread sand, or chips, or salt on all county maintained roads. The following procedures will be followed for material spreading in Johnson County.


Hard Surface Roads: Conditions may warrant the application of sand or chips on hard surface roads only. Gravel Roads: Application of sand or chips will be very limited in use on gravel roads. Button blades will try to cut ice on gravel roads.

Salt application will be used on Business 13 Highway.

WORK SCHEDULE FOR GRADER OPERATIONS

Hard Surface Roads: Road Graders will be used for drifts on hard surface roads that plow trucks cannot remove

Gravel Roads: Road Graders will plow gravel roads when snow is approximately six inches (6") deep or drifting on gravel roads. Road Graders will leave two inches to three inches of snow on the gravel road to retain the gravel on the road surface. In the event of ice on gravel roads, cutting edges with buttons may be used to add traction.

WORK SCHEDULE FOR SNOWPLOW OPERATORS

Snowplow operators will be expected to work eight (8) hour shifts during normal working hours (Monday through Friday, 7:00 a.m. until 3:30 p.m.). In severe inclement weather emergencies or snow events occurring after normal working hours, operators will be required to work in excess of eight (8) hour shifts.

MECHANIC'S RESPONSIBILITIES

- 1. Be available and prepared for call out during snow and inclement weather
- 2. Winterize light and heavy equipment and fully inspected by October 1st
- 3. Repair after snow season with an estimated date of April 1st
- 4. Repair spreaders and plows as necessary by October 15th
- 5. Preform preventative maintenance
- 6. Check all electrical and hydraulic systems on equipment by September 15th

DRIVER'S RESPONSIBILITIES

- 1. Be available and prepared for call out during snow and inclement weather
- 2. Inspect trucks and snow equipment before, during, and after shifts
- 3. Maintenance and care of trucks and snow equipment (Motor Graders and Loaders)
- 4. Follow assigned snow routes
- 5. Apply spreading materials (salt, sand, and chips) at the proper rate
- 6. Check with Road and Bridge Department Supervisor or Assistant Supervisor upon completion of assigned routes to determine if you need to be reassigned to another route
- 7. Report to Road and Bridge Department Supervisor or Assistant Supervisor any equipment breakdown or hazardous conditions in a timely manner
- 8. Clean equipment after snow event

COMPLAINT PROCEDURES

The online complaint form will remain the same for snow and ice events as for other instances. The Road and Bridge Supervisor, Assistant Supervisor, or Crew Leaders on duty may handle emergency complaints. **DISCLAIMER**

To the extent that any previous rule, regulation, policy, or past practice, written or unwritten, is in conflict with the provisions of this policy, such is hereby withdrawn, voided and all personnel should conduct themselves in conformity with this policy.

This policy is not intended to create any duty to any individual member of the public or to protect any particular or circumscribed class of persons. At least one or more of the following, which will delay all or some of the services provided, may affect all or parts of this policy:

- 1. Equipment breakdown
- 2. Vehicles disabled in deep snow
- 3. Weather so severe as to cause crews to be called in from the roads.
- 4. Equipment rendered inadequate by the depth of the snow or drifts.
- 5. Crew breaks, and breaks required or refueling, refilling of material spreaders and installing chains and new blades.
- 6. Unforeseen conditions and emergencies.

Accounts payable in the amount of \$163,124,29 was reviewed and approved for payment.

Stephanie Elkins, Circuit Clerk, called the Salary Commission meeting to order at 9:00 a.m.

Present: William Gabel, Presiding Commissioner; Charlie Kavanaugh, Western Commissioner; John Marr, Eastern Commissioner; Diane Thompson, County Clerk; Mark Reynolds, Assessor; Chad Davis, Auditor; Stormy Taylor, Recorder of Deeds; Nancy Jo Jennings, Public Administrator; Heather Reynolds, Treasurer; Clark Holdren, Coroner; Scott Munsterman, Sheriff; Rob Russell, Prosecuting Attorney. Also present was Dustin Steinhoff from the Daily Star Journal.

Diane Thompson administered the roll call and established a quorum was present.

Stephanie Elkins, opened the floor to nominations for chairman of the commission. Chad Davis motioned and Charlie Kavanaugh seconded that Mark Reynolds be elected chairman of the salary commission meeting. No further nominations were made. The motion passed unanimously.

Diane Thompson distributed the minutes from the 2017 meeting for review. Action at that meeting changed the salary schedule from an increase of 2.75% for every \$50 million increased valuation to an increase in salary for every \$25 million in increased assessed valuation beginning with the 2017 assessed valuation of \$639,549,645.00. Mark Reynolds stated the current assessed valuation is \$669,027,269.00 and therefore the threshold of \$664,549,645.00 has been met for a 2.75% increase effective with the first check of January 2020.

Mark Reynolds opened the floor for discussion on SB 568 (copies presented to the group). This would allow an increase of up to \$6,000 to the base salary for the Sheriff and an increase of up to \$2,000 for all other county elected officials except the full-time Prosecutor. Davis noted that the financial well-being of the county is proved by our bond rating which was a C- in 2011 and is currently an AA rating. Reynolds stated that, as the salary commission considers increases for elected officials, we should also extend raises to employees.

Following discussion, Stormy moved pursuant to 50.327, the Salary Commission approve a \$6,000 increase to the base pay of the Sheriff and a \$2,000 increase to the base pay of the elected officials listed in 50.327.2 RSMo. Munsterman seconded the motion. These increases will take effect for the following elected officials at the beginning of their next term:

- January 2021 Associate Commissioners, Sheriff, Assessor, Treasurer, Public Administrator, Coroner
- January 2023 Presiding Commissioner, Auditor, Clerk, Collector, Recorder

Thompson asked for clarification from Russell on whether the Salary Commission should address the offices elected in 2022 at the 2021 Salary Commission meeting. It was concluded that the Salary Commission may vote on all office's raises at this 2019 Salary Commission meeting to be effective at the next elected official's term.

JCAD offered an annual amount of \$14,000 for rent and \$4,000 for annual operating costs. This can be paid in one annual payment or 12 monthly payments. Commissioner Kavanaugh stated the County Road and Bridge Department would not be able to do snow removal as the plows are too large to maneuver the parking lot. Section 504/ADA Grievance Procedure

The County of Johnson has adopted an internal grievance procedure providing for prompt and equitable resolution of complaints alleging any action prohibited by the Americans With Disabilities Act (ADA) and implementing Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended (29 U.S.C. § 794). Section 504 states, in part, that "no otherwise qualified individual with a disability... shall, solely by reason of her or his disability, be excluded from the participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subject to discrimination under any program or activity receiving federal financial assistance."

- Complaints should be addressed to: Diane Thompson, Johnson County Clerk, 300 N. Holden, Warrensburg, MO 64093, (660) 747-6161, who has been designated by Johnson County to coordinate Section 504/ADA compliance efforts. Complaints should be filed in writing or verbally, contain the name and address of the person filing it, and briefly describe the alleged violation of the regulations.
- 2. A complaint should be filed within ten (10) days after the complainant becomes aware of the alleged violation. (Processing allegations of discrimination that occurred before this grievance procedure was in place will be considered on a case-by-case basis.)
- 3. An investigation, as may be appropriate, will follow a filing of a complaint. The Section 504/ADA Coordinator will be in charge of the investigation. These rules contemplate informal but thorough investigations that afford all interested parties and their representatives an opportunity to submit evidence relevant to a complaint.
- 4. A written determination as to the validity of the complaint and a description of the resolution, if any, will be issued by the Section 504/ADA Coordinator and a copy forwarded to the complainant no later than thirty (30) days after its filing.
- 5. The Section 504/ADA coordinator will maintain the files and records of Johnson County relating to the complaints filed.
- 6. The complainant can request a reconsideration of the case in instances where he or she is dissatisfied with the resolution. The request for reconsideration should be made within 10 days to the Johnson County Commission.
- 7. Using the grievance procedure is not a prerequisite to the pursuit of other remedies, including the filing of a Section 504 or ADA-related complain with the responsible Federal department or agency.
- 8. These rules will be construed to protect the substantive rights of interested persons, meet appropriate due process standards and assure that Johnson County complies with the ADA, Section 504 and their implementing regulations.

The Commissioners met with Rob Russell, Prosecuting Attorney, regarding the increased amount he requested for his 2020 salary line. RECORD OF THE OCTOBER TERM OF THE JOHNSON COUNTY COURT 36th Day's Proceedings, 30th Day of December, 2019

The Honorable Johnson County Commission met this day pursuant to adjournment. Present: Bill Gabel, Presiding Commissioner; John Marr, Eastern Commissioner; Charles Kavanaugh, Western Commissioner; and Diane Thompson, County Clerk. The following proceedings were had to-wit:

The Johnson County Commission held a public hearing at 10:30 a.m., as advertised to adopt the 2020 Johnson County Budget. Those additionally present were County Clerk Diane Thompson, County Auditor Chad Davis, Emergency Management Agency Director Troy Armstrong, and Dustin Steinhoff Daily Star Journal. Commissioner Kavanaugh motioned to adopt and approve the 2020 Johnson County Budget Commissioner Marr seconded the motion. Motion approved unanimously. Presiding Commissioner Gabel presented the 2020 Budget Message.

As the 2020 Budget Year begins, the Commission consisting of Eastern Commissioner John Marr, Western Commissioner Charles Kavanaugh, and Presiding Commissioner Bill Gabel the accepted levies are as follows: GENERAL REVENUE \$0.1275, ROAD AND BRIDGE \$0.2381, and SENATE BILL 40 \$0.1174. The levies set by the County Commission were voluntarily rolled back in 2016 and have remained at those amounts since that year.

It is the intent of this Commission to protect the County funds via prudent adherence to the budget, which we are pleased to say has been successful thanks to <u>all</u> Elected Officials working together.

County roads and bridges have experienced damage from the freeze-thaw cycle and with the diligence of the Road and Bridge Department, corrections were completed. The county will continue to take a strong position requiring preparation of ditch sections and subgrade prior to considering hard surfacing of county roads. We have a healthy Off-System Bridge Replacement and Rehabilitation (BRO) program have one BRO bridge under construction, plus a bridge being built that will generate soft match credit.

The Sheriff is continuing to do an excellent job of keeping his budget balanced while providing for the safety of the County. Sheriff Munsterman is projecting approximately \$1.8 million from out-of-county prisoner housing, which is near what was planned for 2019. This is especially important since the State has not fully reimbursed the County for housing prisoners in recent years and we understand that is likely to further diminish. The new prop P sales tax (1/2%) is expected to generate approximately \$2.5 million annually. Sales Tax is an important source of revenue for the county. That is a less-than-stable source of income, primarily due to the increase in online sales that rarely produces county income; however, the U. S. Supreme Court has ruled that this revenue can be collected. The State Legislature must pass required legislation for this to be successful, which we understand has been passed by the House of Representatives; however the Senate has failed to act.

Johnson County Economic Development Corporation, in conjunction with Johnson County and other economic development partners, has completed the evaluation of our business corridor. We continue to work to meet the requirement of the "certified site" designation and have established an Enhanced Enterprise Zone to encourage business growth. Lifetime Animal Center has joined Fair Mills and Midwest Cast as the third Enhanced Enterprise Business since 2016.

The Spirit Trail is now complete with the hard surfacing was placed in 2019. The required funds were provided by grants through MoDot, Friends of Bikes, and contributions from the County, the City of Warrensburg, and individuals. The DNR portion of the trail to get to Whiteman AFB has completed their plans and is now awaiting funding from the State Legislature.

The Justice Center was paid in full as of November 2019. We will now focus the funds previously dedicated to payment of that lease purchase toward repairs and improvements for other County buildings and equipment. In addition, the Commission is reviewing the 2010 Series Bonds that were issued for the purchase and remodel of the Johnson County Jail and the potential to save taxpayer dollars by refinancing the bonds at a lower interest rate.

The Johnson County Emergency Management Agency Offices have been relocated to a larger facility in the old Johnson County Ambulance District building. This will allow them to more adequately prepare and train for emergency scenarios.

We fully intend to continue to monitor budget adherence and we are proud of the way ALL ELECTED OFFICIALS take their budgets seriously. We are convinced our teamwork makes us the best county in the State when it comes to fiscal responsibility and a cordial work environment.

Commissioner Kavanaugh motioned and Commissioner Marr seconded to approve the ORDER: 2020 Annual Disbursements. Motion approved unanimously.
